## President's Message

Whew. That was quite a month. May was jam packed with all things Optimistic, and I couldn't be more proud.
Between the golf outing, park grand opening, Scholarship awards, DYW, fishing derby, Memorial Fest and opening of the popcorn wagon, you had to be hiding from it to not see our group out and about doing amazing things!

One of the perks of all of that work is attracting new members. And as long as everything stays on plan, we've approved 6 in to the club and have 5 more to approve in June! At the beginning of this year, I sat down with the officers to make some goals, and that was on the top of the list. We will hit our 15 member mark soon!

Now, with that excitement comes great responsibility. My own personal measure of success is not to get the members in to the club, but to have them sign up for a second year. Once they do that, they are hooked!

One of the things I'm doing to help accomplish that KPI is reading a book called "Retention Point" by Robert Skrob. It speaks a lot to how companies like the one I work for keep members after signing them up, but resonates a lot with our type of group. I've learned a few things that we can all do to help make sure when we recruit new members, they stay members!

## 1. Engage.

Make sure they feel engaged. This does not mean simply inviting them to volunteer at random events that we need a large number for. This means we invite them to be parts of committees and planning teams for the events. FInd out what they want to be a part of and get them involved! This will draw them in and feel a part of something versus just an extra body.

## 2. Communicate.

Communication is something we do well on the broad strokes - we send out newsletters and weekly emails that includes pertinent information. However, learning what type of communication works with people, helps keep them interested. I EMAIL ALL THE TIME! I'll attribute that to ease and quantity - but with the new members, especially as we look towards the millennial and Gen Z population, may not check email every day, sometimes a text chain or WhatsApp group might be the right answer. And in complete reverse, a phone call goes a long way. So when looking at the new members, or trying to recruit your own - try and understand how they best learn information and step out of your comfort zone!

## 3. Listen

We have such a dynamic club with so much history, that it is so easy to do what we've always done. Understandably! I'm taking this one away for myself on several levels. Another goal the officers set was to do a survey of the club to understand what members wanted to get out of it. I'm making that a priority for June! Some members only want to work the popcorn wagon once a year - we love them! Some members are looking to network and meet new people because they are new in town - listen to those people and figure out how you can help them use
the club to get what they need! Some folks really just want to give back and will do so in anyway they can - hear them, and call them for everything!

## 4. Follow Through

Here is where I struggle the most! I'm an idea girl, and once it leaves my mouth - there is a good chance I'll never revisit it. I'm working on it. That's why I read so many books - because I know I have faults and the best I can do is to try and correct them. Since that is my weakness - I look to you guys! Remind me when I promise to do something and you haven't seen results. Help me, reach out to the new members that I , the membership committee and their sponsors have already reached out to, and might not think of every opportunity for them. And new members - some of this is on you! If you want to be involved with something, sometimes the chairs may forget or lose the information. Reach back out - stay persistent and get what you want out of your membership!

## 5. Re-engage

Another thing I'm guilty of, is not re-engaging after a strong start. I'm going to look to the membership committee, in cahoots with the marketing committee to come up a with a good plan on how we can keep those new members engaged through that first year. I know we all work better if we have notes and timelines to fill, and I think this will help us all! Let's not just list off all the cool events we do when someone joins, lets check in on them every three months to make sure they are getting all the emails, understand their part in the group, ask if they have any new questions, etc. Remember when you were new? You didn't know all of the questions you wanted to ask in the first $30-90$ days lets keep that in mind! And new members, don't be afraid to ask those questions, even if people aren't checking in. Work with. your sponsor, or other members of the club you know - find out what you want to know!

There is so much more to learn about retaining new members, but l'm only half way through the book. Let me know if you want to borrow it! I've got some good margin notes! There just might be a part 2 to this letter in July!

Thanks for all that you do. We have another big month preparing for the Third of July Parade - please watch for emails, phone calls, in person conversations etc, that you can get involved.

Well, the 2023 Optimist Club of Menomonee Falls Kids Catch and Release Fishing Derby is in the books, and WOW, what a fantastic event it was! This year's fishing derby took place the morning of Saturday, May 13th at the Mill Pond. The weather turned out decent. While it looked like it wanted to rain early, other than maybe a drop or two, the rain stayed away. The temperature was cool, but certainly not has cold as we have seen in the past. And while the
 sun did not come out much, overcast skies provided for some perfect fishing weather. Hundreds of people enjoyed the derby, including the $\mathbf{1 2 3}$ kids who registered to fish, many parents, grandparents, and other family and friends who joined! The fish were biting! Between 10:00 AM and noon, at least $\mathbf{4 3}$ kids caught fish, for a total of at least 99 fish caught.

Some of the highlights of the fish caught were an 11.5" Large Mouth Bass, an $11^{\prime \prime}$ Rainbow Trout, multiple Trouts measuring in at over 10 inches, an $11^{\prime \prime}$ Catfish, and a $14.5^{\prime \prime}$ Sucker Fish. We also had an 8 -year-old who caught 12 fish and a 13 -year-old who caught 15 fish!


During registration, each child received a t-shirt and a grab bag with several different give-aaways, including items from the DNR, candy, coupons, fishing tackle, etc. In addition, representatives from the Germantown Fleet Farm store joined us and handed out items for the kids. Thank you, Fleet Farm! The Neighborhood Watch did a great job keeping any hunger away. They sold coffee, donuts, hotdogs, and other treats from the concession stand. Jerry Mislang did an excellent job emceeing the event using the sound equipment Danny Shepherd set-up and ran throughout the event. In case you missed it, Jerry had many "fish" jokes throughout the morning, which really kept the crowd entertained. Jon Cline took photos throughout the derby! Door prizes were given throughout the morning to all kids who registered, and there was a trophy presentation at the end. And maybe most importantly, the fishing derby allowed for quality time for families in our community to bond with one another and create very special memories. The morning was an absolute success filled with so many smiles!


New this year, we had a 50 / 50 raffle at the fishing derby in honor of the club's 50th anniversary! Ticket sales totaled $\$ 296$, sending a lucky winner home with $\$ 148$ and bringing in $\$ 148$ to the club to help cover some of the costs of the derby.

## 1. Meeting called to order at 7:00am

2. Approval of May meeting agenda, any additions/corrections?

Motion made by Barb Schmit and Seconded by Dan Schwind to accept the May Meeting Agenda. The Motion was approved.
3. Approval of April meeting minutes, any additions/corrections?

Motion was made by Tom Ciskoski and Seconded by John Yusko to accept the April Board Minutes. The Motion was approved.

4. Presentation of donation requests (approvals post presentations)
I. MFHS Softball: Sent in request for $\$ 1,000$ for Uniform Pants. Coach Lou and 2 players from the MFHS Softball team made a presentation to the Board requesting $\$ 1,000$ for new Grey Uniform pants to match the new custom jerseys that the Girls had chosen as the Girls felt that their current black uniform pants did not match with the new Grey jerseys. It was mentioned that the new Uniform pants had already been purchased and that the cost was approximately $\$ 33$ per pair of pants for each of the 30 players on the Team for a $\$ 1,000$ request. It was also mentioned that the custom Jerseys which the team fundraised for and purchased would go with the players at the end of the season but that the uniform pants that they were requesting funding for would stay with the team for future players. The players also mentioned that they were selected as 1 st Seed in the Sectionals and were currently $1^{\text {st }}$ in the conference.
