Diane introduced her family, and told us a little about herself and her time with the New York police department, working as a detective, and working on 9-11. - 2. The meeting agenda was approved by Barb, Linda seconded. Motion carried.
- 3. The September meeting minutes were amended to add Laura Ciletti as attending and approved by Barb, seconded by Mike. Motion carried.
- 4. Donation Requests

 - i. Submitted a budget for \$500

 - i. A budget was submitted asking for \$2,000
- 6. Post Budget Results

 - i. A net profit of \$1,969 was made at the KC bags/meat raffle
 - ii. A net profit of \$2,997 was made at Henny's meat raffle
 - b. Marcia made a budget request of \$2800 or under, if less is made at the upcoming Gobble Wobble meat



raffle, to go to the Resource room. She would like to purchase the items needed and present those to Michelle Olson of the Resource room out of the \$2800.

- c. Tri-Star Soccer Jerry Mislang
 - i. \$358 was spent, under the \$404 requested.

 - i. \$131 was spent, over the \$19 income expected.
- 7. Treasurer's Report—Kim Wenzel
 - a. Jerry moved to approve the Treasurer's report as stated, Mike seconded. Motion carried.
- 8. Action on Donation Requests

 - i. Jerry moved to consider a donation; Linda seconded. Motion carried.
 - ii. After discussion, Jerry moved to approve a donation of \$700, seconded by Mike. Motion carried.
 - b. Patio Players
 - i. Jerry moved to approve a donation of \$3,000; Barb seconded. Motion carried.
- 9. Action on Budget Approvals
 - a. Christmas Parade
 - i. Kim moved to approve the \$500 budget as presented. Linda seconded. Motion carried.
 - b. Drop N Shop
 - i. Barb moved to approve the \$2,000 budget as presented, seconded by Mike. Motion carried.
 - c. Resource Room
 - i. After discussion, it was decided to donate the full \$2800 to the Resource room regardless of whether that much was made at the Gobble Wobble. Motion to approve this request as amended was made by Linda, seconded by Carol. Motion carried.
- 10. New Member Applications
 - i. Linda moved to approve Amanda Klopfenstein as a member, Laura seconded. Motion carried.
- 11. Old Business
 - a. Website John reported that nothing had been done so he restarted the process and was looking for help.
 - b. Nathan Russell was invited to represent the new Marquette club but did not attend.
- 12. New Business
 - a. Annual Budget John and Kim presented an annual budget and asked board members to review the budget.
