2022-2023 Year in Review



It's Time to Think About Leaves!

It's Almost Here!

Next month, we will begin our annual senior citizen leaf-raking event! We're scheduled to start the process on Saturday, November 4th and end by Sunday, November 19th.

How Does It Work?

Senior citizens sign up to have their yards raked by calling the CE&Rec Office by the end of October.



In early November, various youth groups will be assigned to handle the raking. We've added a couple new groups this year—Menomonee Falls 4H Club and the Falls Food Pantry. They will contact the residents to arrange a convenient date and time to rake. While the service is free, donations are encouraged; every donated dollar is matched by the Optimist Club and shared among the participating groups.

How Can You Help? —No Raking Required!

We need a group of Optimist members available to help with trucks or trailers to haul leaves to our drop-off point at Johnson's Nursery if or when necessary. **You don't have to rake!**

If you have access to a pick-up truck or trailer and can be available at times during the leaf-raking period, please let us know so we can add you to the list. If a team needs to have leaves hauled, you will be contacted by the leaf-raking team to coordinate available dates. There are no dedicated dates; the teams will work with you and the homeowner to find a date that works for everyone.



2023 Popcorn Year in Review

This year the season began in mid-May, with the dedication of the Optimist fund raised playground and a movie. It was great for popcorn sales, but it got really cold and it was said to be too windy to inflate the screen. But a fine start for the popcorn wagon as we took in about \$1,200.

Sales for 2023 totaled \$29,264, expenses were \$6,794 and net income was \$22,470. A tidy sum. It seems less than what I remember from last year, but that doesn't seem possible given the additional events this year. I'm looking to get last year's detail so I can see exactly what it was and how the years compare. But I feel things went extremely well this year.

Some new events provided more opportunities, two additional movie nights (with movie problems each time, but we had already sold the popcorn) and Kids Fest, which was an incredible event (popcorn sales were \$875), but attendance was phenomenal and my

observation was that the kids loved it. Very well done. Popcorn sales at the events are not as robust as the first couple of years as there simply are more food options available now. Attendance at the Thursday (Sunset series) concerts remains huge. Lavender Fest was again very successful. Sales were down at Memorial Fest to about \$1,500 (from \$1,800), but that is probably a more realistic figure.

A huge thank you to the captains this year, Len Kimmel, Larry Barbera, Jason Husslein, Barb Schmit, Jeff Saunders, Terry Fitzsimmons, Meg Latus, Linda Tetting, Kathy Matthiessen, Tom Ciskoski, Greg Mattson, Jim & Linda Weitzer (newbies this year and did great with 2 concerts plus kids fest in their week), Shannon Dederich, Carl Trapp and the Sussex club, John Yusko and Dan Schwind. They invariably end up working themselves a couple of nights or more depending on what is happening during their week.

There are two people that aren't captains, but deserve a huge thank you for all they did during various times of need over the summer. First is **Marcia Hebbring** (and **Larry**) who took on multiple concerts and recruited workers even for times she wasn't involved. She also sold popcorn during Memorial Fest in the park for the kids events. The other is **Ann Freudenthal** (and **Fred**) who are always my most reliable fill in when nobody will step up, not to mention how nice clean she keeps things and the signs she makes for me. Thanks so much Marcia and Ann.

Top weeks this year were Jim & Linda Weitzer (\$2,979 who had 2 concerts and kids fest all in their week and Barb Schmit who had 2 concerts in her week. One other week exceeded \$2K, Larry Barbera had \$2,166 buoyed by some very busy week nights which often happens early in the season.

It was great to see a number of new members getting involved at the wagon. It is the most visible part of our club and the easiest way to get involved with other members. One new member, Mitch Rea served as my assistant this summer, helping load and unload the 50 lb. boxes of corn and moving the wagon. Thanks Mitch.

At this writing the wagon should be parked for the winter in Jackson at Tim Newman's business. Amen.

Charter Member Dies

Ron Wilfer, 81 died in Eagle River on August 26, 2023. He was a graduate of Washington High School in Germantown and was one of the 25 original members of the Menomonee Falls Optimist Club when it was formed on August 22, 1973. Ron also served on the Community Memorial Hospital Foundation Board and founded two companies, ArcRon in 1973 and later BurnRight which he sold in 2022. He is survived by his three sons, Todd (Shayne) of Eagle River, Gregg (Lynda) of West Bend, Ryan (Ronja) of Fairbanks, AK and his former wife Jean.
