# It’s Time to Think About Leaves! 



Believe it or not, our annual senior citizen leaf-raking event will be here before we know it! We're scheduled to start the process on Saturday, November $4^{\text {th }}$ and end by Sunday, November $19^{\text {th }}$.

## How Does It Work?

Senior citizens can sign up to have their yards raked by calling the CE\&Rec Office by the end of October.

In early November, various youth groups will be assigned to handle the raking. They will contact the residents to arrange a convenient date and time to rake. While the service is free, donations are encouraged; every donated dollar is matched by the Optimist Club and shared among the participating groups.

## How Can You Help? - No Raking Required!

We need a group of Optimist members available to help with trucks or trailers to haul leaves to our drop-off point at Johnson's Nursery if or when necessary. You don't have to rake!

If you have access to a pick-up truck or trailer and can be available at times during the leaf-raking period, please let us know so we can add you to the list. If a team needs to have leaves hauled, you will be contacted by the leaf-raking team to coordinate available dates. There are no dedicated dates; the teams will work with you and the homeowner to find a date that works for everyone.

## Optimist Club Foundation Board Meeting Minutes

August 1, 2023

Board members in attendance: Fred Blanke, Jeanine Dederich, Don Eisenhauer, Ann Freudenthal \& John Yusko
Board members absent: None
Purpose: Regular meeting of the Board

1. The meeting was called to order at approximately 9:00 am
2. Old Business
a. No discussion
3. New Business
a. Liability insurance (\$750) was paid on June 23
b. Charitable Organization renewal was due July 21
i. Kevin Pollard had agreed to handle, but we have no invoice or proof that it was done
ii. Jeanine will follow up with Kevin
c. As of July 31 , we have about $\$ 288,000$ on deposit
i. $\$ 278,800$ is in a savings account earning about $1.5 \%$
ii. The additional funds $(\$ 9,800)$ are maintained in our checking account
iii. We agreed to keep a balance of $\$ 2,500$ in checking to handle ongoing expenses and contingencies
iv. Ann will move appropriate amounts to savings around the $15^{\text {th }}$ of each month
v. Don asked for a small change to our spreadsheet to show total deposits and payments for multiple years (change made after the meeting)
d. Village Park Campaign Donations
i. We have confirmed pledges of $\$ 1.095$ million, including $\$ 11,000$ of in-kind (non-monetary) donations
ii. $\$ 321,000$ is still to be collected; the last scheduled donation is in 2026
iii. We will invoice the Optimist Club for its scheduled 2023 donation of \$16,666
iv. We will pay the Village around $\$ 300,000$ in October; a final amount will be decided at the October Foundation Board meeting and will be dependent on our account balances at the time
v. $\$ 200,000$ pledged by Milwaukee Tool will be disbursed directly to the Village, not through the Foundation
e. Future donation opportunities
i. We agreed that we want to have information about donations on the new website under construction with K-Kom; John has mentioned this to Shannon and will remind her and Ron Kohl at K-Kom
ii. We want to formalize and document processes for people to make "in memoriam" gifts as well as to leave gifts through estate planning and have the information available on our website page
4. The next meeting is scheduled for October $5^{\text {th }}$ at 9 am
5. The meeting was adjourned at approximately 9:45 am

2. Approval of August meeting agenda, any additions/corrections?

Motion: John Yusko Seconded: Mike Russell to accept the July Meeting Agenda. The Motion was approved.
3. Approval of July meeting minutes, any additions/corrections?


Motion was made by Mike Russell and Seconded by Scott Dreier to accept the July Board Minutes. The Motion was approved.
4. Presentation of donation requests (approvals post presentations)
