Meat Raffles

Attention all Optimists! You may have seen notes about these meat raffles throughout the year and are happy to report that they are doing well above projections and bringing both donations and interest in to the club. The great volunteer crew that has made these happen is small but mighty, but now needs your help! It's hard work raising \$18,000 over the course of just seven raffles! And we have two to go!

Still on the calendar for this year are these dates available: April 6. Players Pub May 11. Water Street Pub and Grill

They will be kicking up again in September with a bags tournament at

Knights of Columbus, with a schedule to come.

First and foremost, committee members are welcomed and needed. Fresh ideas keep these events relevant and prevent burnout with existing members. The schedule of meetings is variable, usually meeting the Tuesday before each event, and will meet for an after action session and planning for the 2024-25 season. This team is responsible for creating the schedule, marketing, board communications and providing the coordinators of each event.

Beyond the committee each event requires 10+ volunteers ranging in the following duties and commitments:

Shopper (helps procure the items for the raffle baskets - usually the week before the event, using their talents to find good deals, work with others in coordinating picking up, ordering or just going to the store)

MC (the day of the event, on the mic making sure the audience is aware of not only the different raffles going on, but what the club is up to, maybe some jokes - anyone with experience, or wanting to get experience! A great way to break some public speaking fears! Each event could use one or more, so volunteering for a little practice or to see if you like it is not a huge commitment!)

Peddler (teamed up with another person the day of the event to sell raffle tickets, 50/50 or other items up for sale - we work with two different teams of sellers for each event so you can not only volunteer, but enjoy your time there!)

Bookkeeper (2 or three per raffle are needed to track the raffle ticket numbers, collect money from the peddlers and make sure everything checks out, and count money and report to committee at the end of the event for what has been collected, paid out, etc. No accounting experience necessary - just know how to count:))

Vannas (Male or female Vanna's needed! People through out the day carry around the meat raffle baskets to show off to the audience what is up for raffle, maybe answer questions about whats in each and direct people on where to buy tickets - super low commitment, and a lot of fun. Just need to be able to carry about 25 lbs for 5 minutes at a time!)

Coordinator. (Each event has a team of coordinators - which are responsible for working with the venue for times, logistics and making sure there are enough volunteers, etc. For this, attending the monthly meat raffle meeting is helpful to get to know the additional committee members, what all is entailed, joining an experienced team for a go around etc. This person(s) makes sure that the event holds to our previous raffle standards and runs without a hitch! This is a really great way to try your hand at organizing or chairing an Optimist event - where a team of really experienced members are there to help you step by step)

Purpose: Regular monthly meeting

- 1. The meeting was called to order at approximately 7:00 am.
- 2. Barb moved to approve the agenda; Mike seconded. Motion carried. Jerry moved to approve the February minutes; Linda seconded. Motion carried.

- 3. Presentation of Donation Requests
 - a. Good Shepherd Catholic Church Catholic Heart Workcamp Corinna Ramsey
 - i. The cost of the camp will be about \$32,000, they charge the families \$600. They are trying to raise money for part of the \$8,000 shortfall from last year.

 - i. Banner inside Trenary Field for \$300 or facing Pilgrim Rd for \$600.

- 5. Activity Post-Budget Results
 - a. March Meat Raffle at DJ's
 - i. John reported that after expenses, we made \$2,223.32.
- 6. Treasurer's Report-Kim Wenzel
 - a. Mike moved to approve the report, Linda seconded. Motion carried.
 - b. OI Foundation Account/Impact on our Funds
 - i. There was discussion on the fact that OI stated if we wanted to move money from our account with them for the sake of opening CD's, we would need to close the account to get that money. We decided to close that account and put the money in staggered CD's, in a money market account, and the remainder in our club's general account.
